About TT Rationalist

We thought, "What if we provide the user with a collection of matching fonts, each of which would still be unique?" - and so we started developing TT Rationalist.

For those familiar with the bestsellers TT Norms® and TT Commons, the new font will be intuitive to use. It has similar proportions, characteristics and functionality, but yet it is an independent and original font family. Unlike the geometric sans serifs TT Norms® and TT Commons, TT Rationalist is a slab font. It is functional and original. Slabs are characterized by massive rectangular serifs, but in TT Rationalist they are trapezoidal and refined, which makes them look modern.

Speaking of modernity, when creating the typeface, we wanted to avoid the excessive historicism that can be seen in many slab fonts. We have been particularly careful working on the Black style, which in the first sketches had something in common with the Wild West posters. When we balanced out the excessive contrast caused by visual compensation, the font stopped evoking retro associations. Now TT Rationalist Black is perfect for headlines, especially on posters and posters, and works great with Light styles in TT Norms® and TT Commons.

The new font works well for both headings and text arrays. It looks especially aestheti-

cally pleasing in printed production (books, magazines, brochures). The TT Rationalist font family consists of 22 two styles: 10 upright, 10 real Italics and two variable fonts, each with over 950 glyphs. It supports over 200 languages and contains 27 OpenType features. In addition to the standard ones, there are small capitals for Latin and Cyrillic fonts, alternative versions of the ampersand and the letter g. The italics have two stylistic sets allowing to switch the design of style-forming characters (k, v, w, y, z) between italic and classical forms.

More formally, rationalism is defined as a methodology or a theory "in which the criterion of the truth is not sensory but intellectual and deductive".

TT Rationalist Thin 16 pt

That is to say, rationalists asserted that certain rational principles exist in logic, mathematics, ethics, and metaphysics that are so fundamentally true.

TT Rationalist ExtraLight 16 pt

Different degrees of emphasis on this method or theory lead to a range of rationalist standpoints, from the moderate position to the more extreme one.

TT Rationalist Light 16 pt

In an old controversy, rationalism was opposed to empiricism, where the rationalists believed that reality has an intrinsically logical structure.

TT Rationalist Thin Italic 16 pt

The rationalists had such a high confidence in reason that empirical proof and physical evidence were regarded as unnecessary to ascertain certain truths.

TT Rationalist ExtraLight Italic 16 pt

Given a pre-modern understanding of reason, rationalism is identical to philosophy, the Socratic life of inquiry, or the zetetic (skeptical) clear interpretation of authority.

Examples

In recent decades, Leo Strauss sought to revive "Classical Political Rationalism" as a discipline that understands the task of reasoning as maieutic.

TT Rationalist Regular 16 pt

In this regard, the philosopher John Cottingham noted how rationalism, a methodology, became socially conflated with atheism, a worldview.

TT Rationalist Normal 16 pt

Rationalism is often contrasted with empiricism. These views are not mutually exclusive, since a philosopher can be both rationalist and empiricist.

TT Rationalist Medium 16 pt

In the 17th-century Dutch Republic, the rise of early modern rationalism – as a highly systematic school of philosophy in its own right for the first time in history.

TT Rationalist Italic 16 pt

In politics, rationalism, since the Enlightenment, historically emphasized a "politics of reason" centered upon rational choice, deontology, utilitarianism.

TT Rationalist Normal Italic 16 pt

The use of the label 'rationalist' to characterize a world outlook which has no place for the supernatural is becoming less and less popular today.

TT Rationalist Medium Italic 16 pt

Examples

You don't have to get up off your couch and go outside and examine the way things are in the physical world. You don't have to do any science.

TT Rationalist DemiBold 16 pt

Whereas both philosophies are under the umbrella of epistemology, their argument lies in the understanding of the warrant.

TT Rationalist Bold 16 pt

The rationalist believes we come to knowledge a priori – through the use of logic – and is thus independent of sensory experience.

TT Rationalist ExtraBold 16 pt

Between both philosophies, the issue at hand is the fundamental source of human knowledge and the proper techniques for verifying what we think we know.

Epistemologists are concerned with various epistemic features of belief, which include the ideas of justification, warrant, rationality, and probability.

The precise method one uses to provide justification is where the lines are drawn between rationalism and empiricism among philosophical views.

Generally speaking, intuition is a priori knowledge or experiential belief characterized by its immediacy; a form of rational insight.

In addition, a rationalist can choose to adopt the claim of Indispensability of Reason and or the claim of Superiority of Reason.

Taken to extremes, the empiricist view holds that all ideas come to us a posteriori, that is to say, through experience; either through the external senses or through such inner sensations as pain and gratification.

Immanuel Kant; 22 April 1724 – 12 February 1804) was a German philosopher and one of the central Enlightenment thinkers. Kant's mother, Anna Regina Reuter (1697–1737), was born in Königsberg (since 1946 the city of Kaliningrad).

Kant left Königsberg shortly after August 1748—he would return there in August 1754. He became a private tutor in the towns surrounding Königsberg, but continued his scholarly research. In 1749, he published his first philosophical work.

In 1740, aged 16, he enrolled at the University of Königsberg. He studied the philosophy of Gottfried Leibniz and Christian Wolff under Martin Knutzen (Associate Professor of Logic and Metaphysics from 1734 until his death in 1751).
